

# FAFSA Nght January 25<sup>th</sup>



To complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form, you will need:

- Your Social Security number
- Your Alien Registration number (if you aren't a U.S. citizen)
- Your federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned
- For the 2023–24 FAFSA application, you will need 2020 income information
- Bank statements and records of investments (if applicable)
- Records of untaxed income (if applicable)
- An FSA ID so you can electronically sign the FAFSA

\*If you are a dependent student, then you'll also need the above information for your parent(s).


