History of the School

Hillcrest High School became the fifth high school in the Tuscaloosa County School System in the fall of 1981. Initially, the school served the students in South Tuscaloosa County in grades 7 through 12. The facility had been a former elementary school. The southern part of the county continued to grow, and in 1991, the present facility was constructed for grades 9 through 12. Additional growth in the southern portion of the county was spurred by the quality of area schools, and more classroom space was needed. A new 25-classroom addition was completed in the summer of 2002.

School and Community

Hillcrest High School is one of six high schools in the Tuscaloosa County School System. It is a comprehensive high school housing grades 9 through 12 accredited with AdvancedED. Located in a rapidly growing community, it draws students from various ethnic, socioeconomic, and demographic backgrounds. The class schedule includes eight periods each day. Students are able to earn seven credits per year. In addition to attending classes on the local campus, students may attend classes at the system's Tuscaloosa Center for Technology Academy, participate in dual enrollment programs at local colleges and universities, or seek higher education opportunities for banked credit.

We offer **Pre-Advanced Placement** courses in all content areas, and they are given a .5 GPA weight. AP Courses are given a 1 point GPA weight.
