Course Description:

U.S. Government Studies the principles of the American system of government so that you can understand the rights and responsibilities that come with U.S. citizenship. Rules

- 4. Electronic devices should be stored AWAY unless given permission to use. I have a charging station at the front of the room. Once phones are on the charge they are not touched or moved until the end of class. On TEST days ALL phones must be placed in the phone caddy for the duration of the block period.
- 5. Go to the restroom BEFORE or AFTER class. Students have multiple opportunities throughout the day. DO NOT come into the classroom to put down your belongings, then ask to go the restroom. My answer will be "don't be tardy" 6. You must RESPECT your classmates, the teacher, and yourselves. Respect others' opinions, ideas, belongings, personal space, etc. Disrespect will not be tolerated. Be kind; be courteous. Always remember: It's Nice to be Nice!

Grading:

Grading will be calculated on a point system that includes major grade (tests/projects) and daily grades (quizzes, class work, homework, bell work). At the completion of each nine weeks students will take a final cumulative exam (exemptions based on TCSSBOE policy). Virtual assignments through Schoology and/or in class assignments will be tabulated for a comprehensive grade in PowerSchool ****THIS IS A 9 WEEK, HALF CREDIT COURSE. *****

Attendance and Make-up Work:

- ---Students are expected to attend class in accordance with the attendance policy listed in the Code of Student Conduct.

Expectations

- --Tests will be given at the end of a unit study. Students will know in advance about an upcoming test. The test format will include multiple choices, matching, true/false, identification, short discussion. All major points assignments (including tests) will be on the class calendar in Schoology and in the classroom.
- -Projects may be assigned throughout the year. Students will have to use teamwork, internet resources and information given in class to complete projects. All projects will be graded using a rubric.
- -Participation is required and students will receive weekly points. Participation will be based on actively participating in class discussion, activities, or Schoology assignments.
- --Homework and assignments are due at the beginning of class in the basket near my desk. **Late work (any assignment turned in after initial collection) will have points docked
- -All class work is due at the end of class unless accommodations have been allowed for extension. Extensions will be completed for homework and must be turned in at the beginning of class the following school day.
