

When reading, it is important to understand the difference between facts and opinions and to be able to distinguish which is which. A fact is something that is true. An opinion is something that someone *believes* is true.

The Beauty of Slovenia

1. Nestled in the heart of Europe, bordering Italy, Austria, Hungary, Croatia, and a short stretch of the Adriatic Sea, lies the small country of Slovenia. Prior to its independence in 1991, the Republic of Slovenia was a part of the former Yugoslavia, which experienced many turbulent years at the end of the millennium. In May 1992, Slovenia was accepted into the United Nations and two years later, into the European Union. The



- way was then clear for the small country to develop as a democratic nation.
- 2. Slovenia has continued to improve its economy since independence, particularly in the tourist industry. Each year, more than a million visitors from other European countries vacation in Slovenia, and new resorts are being built to meet the demands of the booming industry. The climate guarantees warm summers and plenty of snow in the winter.
- 3. The country is blessed with many outstanding physical features that make it the perfect destination for a vacation—mountains, lakes, rivers, forests, and natural and thermal springs. Areas of primeval forest can still be found; the largest of which is in the Kocevje region in the south of the country, where a chance encounter with a brown bear is still possible.
- 4. A number of regions within Slovenia are of international environmental significance:
 - In the far northwest lies the remarkable Triglav National Park, a true paradise of majestic mountains, valleys, lakes, and waterfalls. The park, named Triglav (meaning "three heads") after Slovenia's highest peak, has a diverse plant and animal population. The beauty of this region captivates the hearts of all those who visit.
 - Situated close to Ljubljana, the country's capital, are the awesome Skocjan Caves—a network of eleven caves with a number of spectacular features, such as the swallow holes and natural bridges, which leave the visitor with an everlasting impression of the wonder and magnificence of nature.
 - Although an unattractive and plain sight to behold, the very special ecological conditions that have been created in the coastal Secovlje saltpans have seen many of Slovenia's endangered plant species flourish. About 80 species of birds nest there regularly.
 - Cerknica Lake, to the southwest of Ljubljana, is an impressive phenomenon. When full to capacity,
 it is the largest lake in the country, but during the dry season, it can be completely emptied as the
 water drains through underground streams. With the autumn rains and the snows melting in the
 spring, the underground streams swell. The level of the lake then rises, and the volume of water can
 no longer be contained.
- 5. Slovenia's capital city, Ljubljana, is a charming old town with many parks and buildings of great architectural interest. Perched on the summit of a wooded hill, Ljubljana Castle dominates the capital. Along with the National Museum, the castle is a very interesting place to visit, providing insight into the history of this wonderful old town and country.
