COURSE DESCRIPTION AND PREREQUISITES

Algebra I is the study of the structure of the real number system with specific attention to algebraic properties and operations, problem solving, and higher-order thinking skills. Topics of study include variables, expressions, linear and non-linear equations, functions, inequalities, ratio, proportion, factoring polynomials, graphing on the number line and in the coordinate plane, properties of slope, and operations involving exponents. This course fulfills the graduation requirement of one unit of Algebra.

***Completion of Algebra A and Algebra B fulfills the graduation requirement of Algebra 1 and provides 2 math credits.**

NINE WEEKS GRADES

- Grades will be based on various methods of assessment. These methods include, but are not limited to unit tests, homework, classwork, quizzes (announced and unannounced), daily warm-ups, class participation, notebook checks, writing assignments, and projects. Grades will be figured on a total points basis. The total number of points earned will be divided by the total number of points possible.
- A comprehensive nine weeks exam, which counts as 10% of the nine weeks average, will be administered at the end of the first three grading terms. A comprehensive final exam covering the entire year's material will be administered at the end of the fourth grading term and counts as 20% of the overall final course grade.

FINAL COURSE AVERAGE

The final comprehensive exam counts for 20% of the course average.

To determine the final course average, add the 4 nine week averages and the 1 final exam grade, then divide the sum by 5.

FINAL EXAM EXEMPTION CRITERIA

Students may earn an exemption from the comprehensive final exam if they:

- Possess an A average with 6 or fewer class absences* OR
- Possess a B average with 4 or fewer class absences* OR
- Possess a C average with 2 or fewer class absences*

AND have no discipline referrals to the office that result in detention or suspension.

- ❖ Approved school-related absences (field trips, school sports, etc.) do not affect the exemption status of a student.
- ❖ Does not apply to Pre-AP Courses
