English 12 2016-2017

Course Description: English 12 combines the study of British literature and communication in the workplace. The course prepares students for college and/or technical school after high school. Students survey British authors and works of these literary types: short story, novel, poetry, drama, and essay. Students participate in library research, complete group and individual projects, produce original writings, and conduct analyses of literature using both written and oral communication skills. Students review English skills necessary for success on scholastic aptitude tests and post-secondary school admission tests. The course will adhere to the Alabama Common Core Standards/Alabama College and Career Readiness Initiative.

Course Prerequisites: Passage of previous English 11 course

Textbooks (classroom set only): Glencoe Literature: British Literature

Elements of Language

Materials Needed:

- <u>2" binder</u> This binder will hold loose-leaf notebook paper and handouts. The binder should be brought to class every day and contain only English materials.
- 2) <u>Loose-leaf notebook paper</u> This will be kept in students' binders and used during class. Students will need a large supply of notebook paper.
- 3) <u>Divider tabs</u> These will be used to divide the notebook into sections. Each student needs at least five divider tabs.
- 4) **Pens/Pencils** Only blue and black ink pens can be used for graded assignments.
- 5) **Highlighters**

Classroom Rules:

- 1. Be respectful.
- 2. Raise your hand to be recognized before speaking.
- 3. Do not bring gum or food into the classroom. Students may have only drinks with screw-on caps.
- 4. Do not leave seat without permission.
- 5. Be prepared daily for class.
- 6. Do not put away your materials until Mrs. Tucker concludes class.

Classroom Curriculum:

- 1. <u>Word of the Day (WOTD)</u> At the beginning of every class period, students will copy a word of the day. A new word, its definition, and a sample sentence using the word will be provided by the teacher. By the end of each day, students will be expected to correctly pronounce the word of the day, develop a sentence correctly using the word in context, and incorporate the word in future writing assignments. Students will be tested at two-week intervals on the words of the day they have learned and will be responsible for any of the words learned since the beginning of the semester.
- 2. <u>Daily Grammar Practice (DGP)</u> This is a daily grammar activity that must be completed at the beginning of class every day. The incorrect sentences will be on the board, and students will correct the sentences in their notebooks. These corrections will be kept in each student's notebook and will count for occasional daily grades. DGP Quizzes will be given periodically throughout the semester.
- 3. <u>Grammar/Literature</u> Every class period will be devoted to achieving the grammar and literature objectives established by the Alabama Common Core Standards/Alabama College and Career Readiness Initiative.
- 4. <u>Tests</u> Tests will be given frequently due to the extensive amount of material that must be covered. The majority of tests will be timed.
- 5. <u>Writing</u> The four modes of writing (expository, narrative, descriptive, and persuasive) will be explored during this course. Literary analysis will be a major focus of writing assignments.
- 6. <u>Research Projects</u> Students will be required to complete at least one research project during the spring semester. More information about these projects will be provided at a later date.
- 7. <u>Homework</u> Homework will be given regularly. Homework will not be excessive; it is specifically meant to review the day's progress and to further enhance the following day's classroom discussions.

Personal Electronic Devices

Technology can be a valuable educational resource. Students are allowed to use electronic and technological devices at **SPECIFIED** times and **ONLY** when authorized by the teacher for an instructional purpose. Devices such as smart phones, Kindles, Nooks, laptops, and iPads are items that students can use at the designated time.

Capturing pictures and/or recordings during class is prohibited unless students have consent from the teacher. Students are not allowed to charge their phones in the classroom. If a student is using a device inappropriately (not in accordance with classroom instruction or TCBOE policy), consequences will be enforced as stated in the Code of Conduct Handbook.

Grading Policy:

All grades, except for the nine-weeks' exams and final exam, will be daily grades. Daily grades will include homework, daily work, quizzes, tests, writings, projects, notebook checks, participation, and presentations. Each comprehensive nine-weeks' exam will count 15% of the final grade for each grading period. The final exam, which is 20% of a student's final course grade, will be comprehensive of both semesters' work.

All of students' graded assignments will be kept in student folders in Mrs. Tucker's classroom. Students will be given allotted class time to review their grade folders. If students and/or parents/guardians wish to view graded work outside of assigned class time, they need to arrange an appointment with Mrs. Tucker. Students' graded assignments will not leave Mrs. Tucker's classroom.

Class Attendance:

Attendance is expected. Due to the limited amount of time each semester offers to cover the content, every minute of class time is valuable and will be effectively used. Any time missed due to absence from the classroom will result in the student missing valuable material.

If a student does miss class time due to an absence, the student is responsible for obtaining make-up work within two days of returning to school. If a student misses an announced test or project due date because of an absence, the student will be required to make up the test or to turn in the project on the first day he or she returns to school. All make-up work will be recorded as a zero until it is completed.

If a student is removed from the classroom due to misconduct, the student will NOT be allowed to make up any missed work.

Tardies will be assigned when the tardy bell rings if students are not seated in their desks and ready to begin class.

Hall passes will be issued at the teacher's discretion. Hall passes will be issued only for emergency situations. <u>Each student will NOT be issued more than one hall pass per nine weeks.</u> Students with medical needs that require them to leave class will need to present a note from the nurse.

All Tuscaloosa County Board of Education policies will be strictly enforced.
