Advanced English 12 Mrs. Day Fall 2021

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# **Course Description**

This course provides advanced 12th grade students with opportunities to enhance their abilities in written and oral communication through studies of composition and British literature. Students study the works of British authors as a basis for literary analysis. Students improve language skills through research activities, original writing, and critical analysis of literature.

It is recommended that you wait to purchase all novels I will notify you two weeks before a required text is scheduled to be read. Often times, book stores will be out of a novel or circumstances may occur that prohibit us from completing a novel. In those cases, the teacher may simply provide excerpts from the novel or even change the reading.

\*Note: SUPPLIES ARE REQUIRED—NOT OPTIONAL. The student should bring all supplies to class each day.

# A. Classroom Expectations and Rules

<u>Entering the Classroom:</u> All students should arrive at class on time and ready to learn. This includes having all materials needed to complete assignments on a daily basis. Once in the classroom, students should immediately become settled and begin to work on the word of the day. Students should also use this time to sharpen all pencils, turn in any completed homework, and check for makeup assignments.

<u>During Class:</u> Students are expected to actively participate in all activities, including discussion, note taking, listening, etc. Questions and discussion about related topics are highly encouraged. Students are also expected to remain in their seats during class (unless otherwise instructed) and to be respectful when others are speaking.

After Class: Students are not dismissed by bell but by the teacher. Students should make sure all trash is picked up and desks are returned to their original rows before leaving. DO NOT get up and stand at my door like wild animals waiting on the bell to ring. Stay in your assigned seat until you are dismissed.

# B. Attendance Policy and Make-Up Policy

Class attendance/online presence is essential for success in this class. Tardies will be assigned if a student is not in his or her seat and ready to work when the bell rings. Furthermore, if a student is removed from the classroom due to misconduct, the student's absence will be considered unexcused, and the student will not be allowed to make up any missed work.

It is the responsibility of the student with an absence to make arrangements for makeup work within two days of returning to school. Students should check the "What did I Miss" folders for missed assignments, ask a trustworthy friend, or as a last resort, come ask me. If you are absent on a test day, be prepared to take the test the day you return!! If you are a part of a group project and you do not show on the day of your group presentation, your participation grade must be made up outside of class time. Your group members depend on you to commit to the project. All make-up work will be recorded as a zero until it is completed.

<sup>\*\*</sup>If a due date for a large project, writing assignment, or test has been set ahead of time, you

should be ready to turn in the assignment or take the test immediately.

# C. Grading Policy

All students are expected to submit all work in class or online on the date due, unless otherwise instructed. Grades will be received for daily starters, homework, participation, tests, quizzes—announced and unannounced—activities, projects, writing assignments, presentations, and any other material designated by the teacher as "for a grade." The total number of points earned will be divided by the total number of points possible.

I do not accept late work for daily grades, especially when time is wasted in class. Late projects, homework, essays, major writing assignments, etc. may be accepted one day late for half credit at the teacher's discretion.

#### D. Advanced Work Load

This is an advanced course, so you should expect the course to be challenging. Content in advanced class sections is expected to be covered at a faster pace than content in a standard course, and students will be expected to go more in-depth with their learning. Students in advanced sections will be required to do a majority, if not all, of class readings at home prior to the next school day so that our class time can be used for discussion, analysis, and reflection. Students are expected to take initiative, demonstrate self-discipline, improve academic performance, and build resilience.

# **E. Exemption Policy**

# EXAM EXEMPTION (GRADES 9-12) FOR ONE-HALF CREDIT AND ONE CREDIT (TWO NINE-WEEK COURSES)

In order to be exempt from a final exam at the end of a one-half credit, two nine-week grading period course and/or a one credit, two nine-week grading period course, a 9-12 grade student must

- Possess an A (90-100) average with 3 or fewer absences, or
- Possess a B (80-89) average with 2 or fewer absences, or
- Possess a C (70-79) average with 1 or fewer absences, AND
- Have no discipline referrals that result in detention, in-school intervention, or suspension during the term/semester.
- \*The final course grade for students in grades 9-12 who meet exemption criteria will be determined from the average of the two nine-week grading period for both a half-credit and a full credit course.

# F. Personal Electronic Devices

Technology can be a valuable educational resource. Students are allowed to use electronic and technological devices at **SPECIFIED** times and **ONLY** when authorized by the teacher for an instructional purpose. If devices are out without teacher instruction, they will be taken up and turned in to the office. Devices such as smart phones, Kindles, Nooks, laptops, and iPads are items that students can use at the designated time. Students may, at the teacher's approval, also use these devices to replace paperback/hard-cover novels required for purchase/use for reading assignments; however, students are encouraged to use texts on which they can annotate, allowing them to develop the skills necessary for literary analysis and success on tests and writing assignments. Capturing pictures and/or recordings during class is prohibited unless students have consent from the teacher. **If a student is using a device inappropriately (not in accordance with classroom instruction or TCBOE policy), consequences will be enforced as stated in the Code of Conduct Handbook.** 

#### G. DGP/Word(s) of the Week

Every day that you come in, DGP (Daily Grammar Practice) will be on the board for you to complete. As soon as you sit down, you will need to get started on the DGP. Sometimes you will

come to the board to complete your DGP, sometimes we will review it as a class, and sometimes I may take it up. I DO NOT have to warn you that DGP will be taken up. It is my expectation that you are completing it, even if you may not have all of the correct answers.

Every week, you will have a word(s) of the week that you must become familiar with, memorize, and learn to incorporate into your own personal vocabulary. You will have activities with these words, and you will be tested on them every few weeks.

# H. Schoology

The Tuscaloosa County School System has chosen Schoology as the virtual platform that will be utilized in the classroom. Teachers will provide instruction and coursework in Schoology that students will be required to complete. This virtual content will consist of, but is not limited to the following: instructional videos, assessments, discussion board posts, writing assignments, etc. Each item will have a due date posted, and all work is expected to be completed by the date posted. Work posted after the due date will be considered late.

Students have two options to login. Students can go to the Tuscaloosa County School's homepage and click the "Schoology" link at the top and enter login credentials there.
