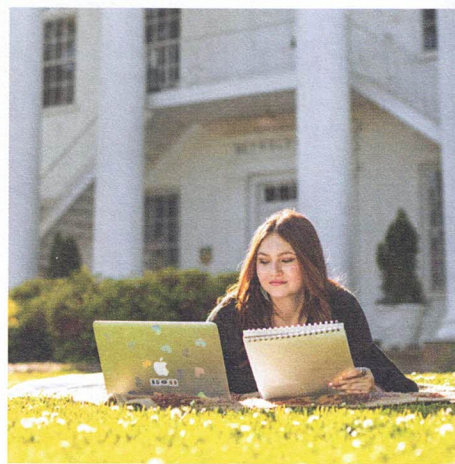
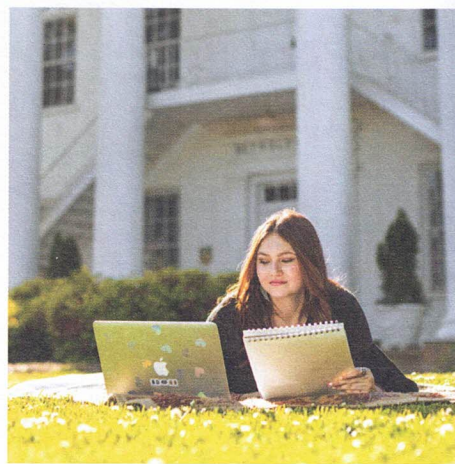

FIRST-YEAR ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

We've gone test-optional! Students with a minimum high school cumulative GPA of 3.0 may apply to UM without taking the ACT or SAT through fall 2022. All other applicants must have:

Minimum high school cumulative GPA 2.5

AND

ACT minimum composite score 20
ACT code: 0004

OR

SAT minimum composite score 1030
SAT code: 1004

Students with an ACT of 18 or 19 or 960-1020 SAT may be considered for regular admission on the basis of a scale of increasing grade point average.

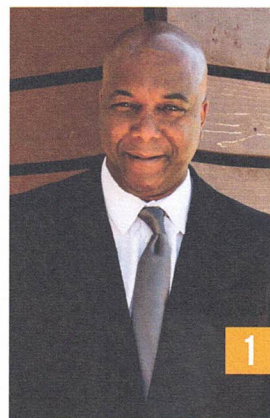

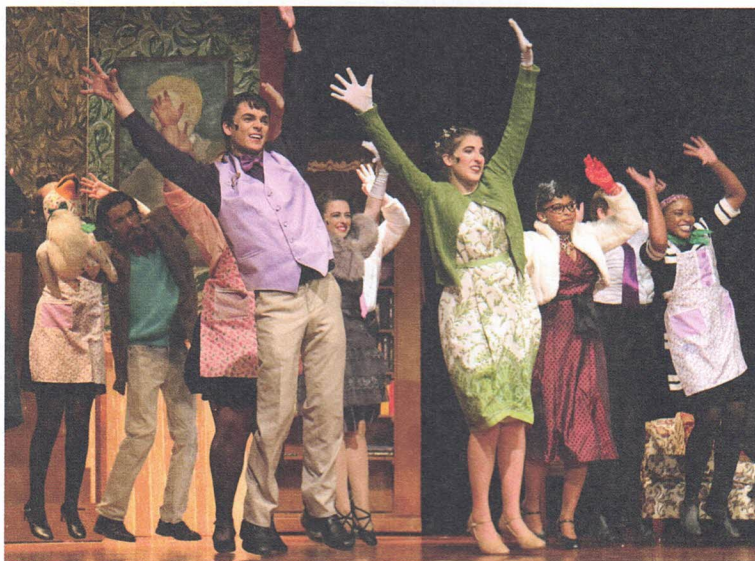
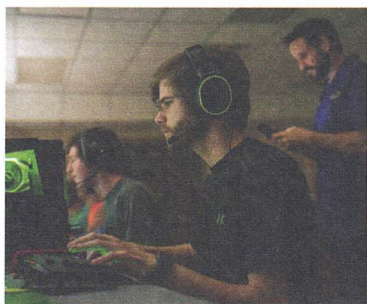

RESIDENCE LIFE & DINING

Each of UM's nine residence halls offers a unique range of amenities, from private baths to kitchen areas to apartment-style living. You'll be close to your classes, recreational facilities, food services and other campus buildings. Housing is first-come, first-served, so submit your housing application early at montevallo.edu/housing. If you'd like to request a preferred roommate, you may do so on your housing application.

All resident students must participate in a residential dining meal plan of their choice. Options include:

- Unlimited meals and 100 Flex Points
- 15 meals/week and 150 Flex Points
- 10 meals/week and 250 Flex Points

Commuter students have the option to purchase 200 Flex Points.

Falcon Flex Points can be used at any on-campus dining location and at select local restaurants.
