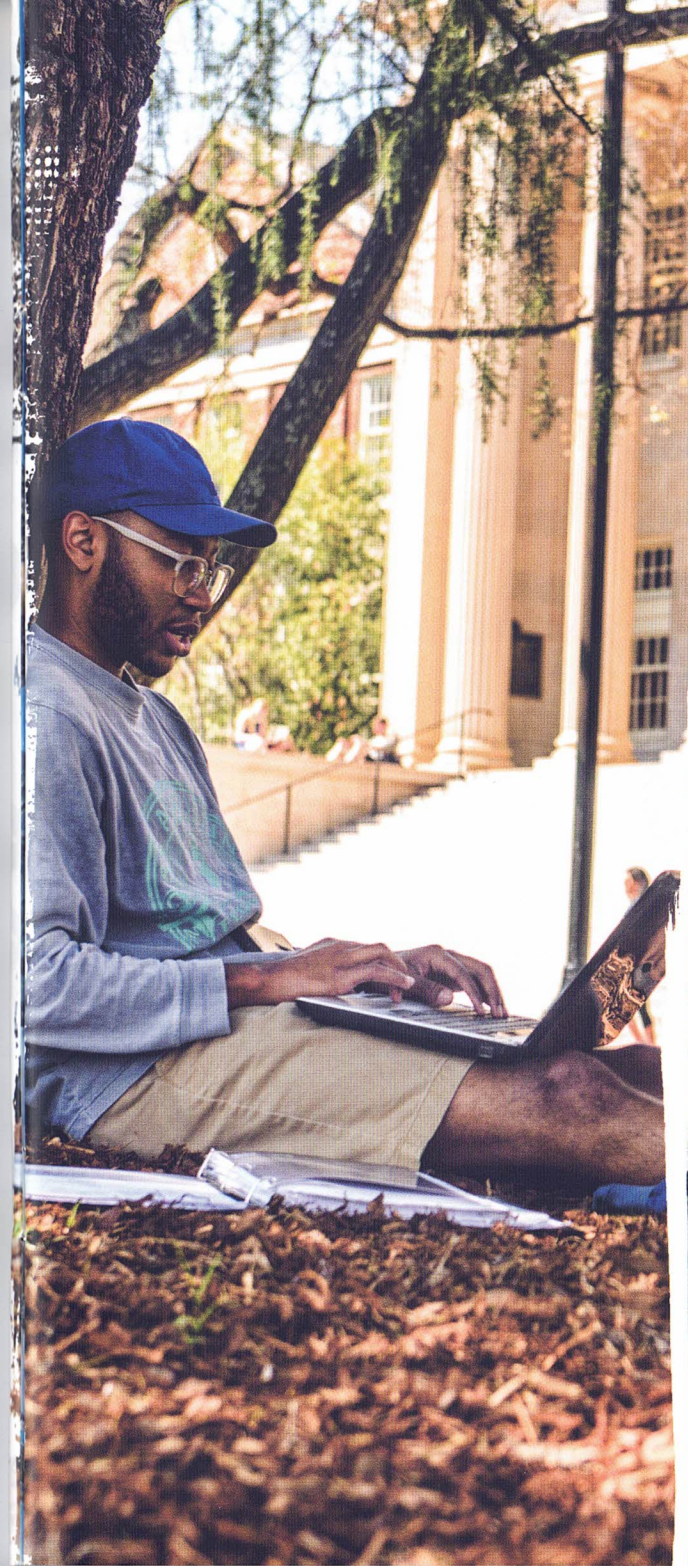

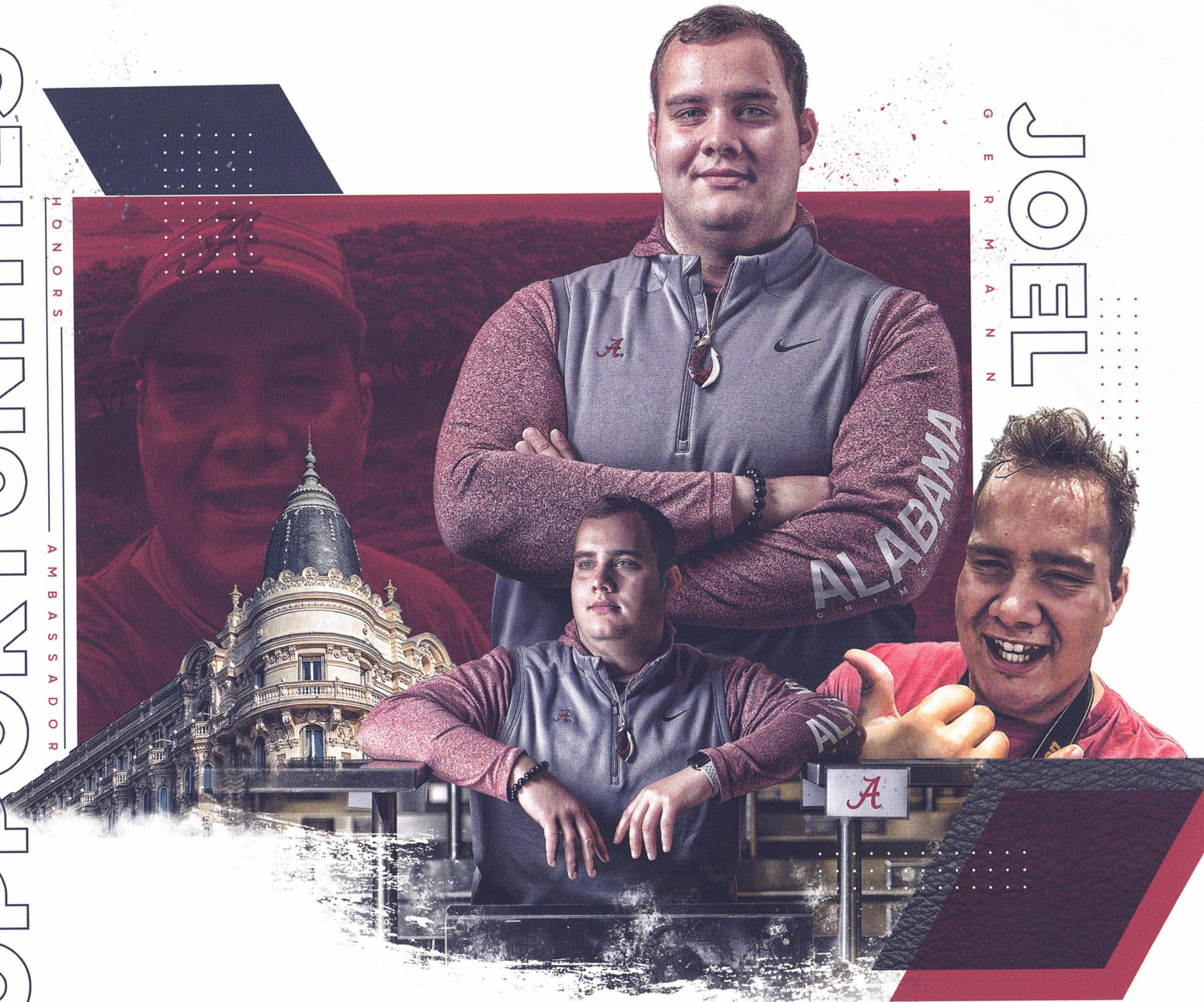

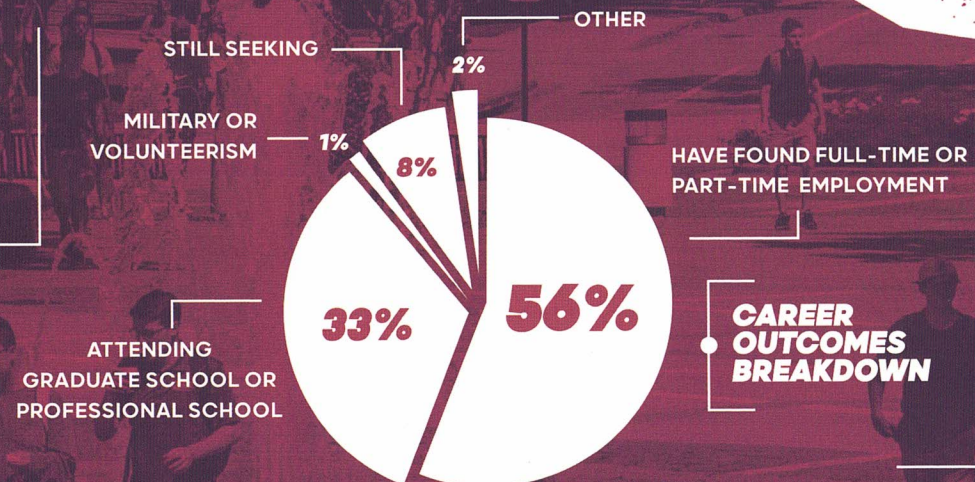

EXCEEDING ALL EXPECTATIONS

On the brink of graduation last spring, **National Merit Scholar** Jane Gillette learned she had been selected for not one but two prestigious national honors. Named a Brooke Owens Fellow, a recognition of exceptional undergraduate women and gender-minority students in aerospace, **Jane** was also selected as an Aviation Week 20 Twenties for 2020, positioning her as one of the **Top 20 STEM** students in the nation.

After graduating from **UA** in May, Jane spent the summer interning with Boeing in Cape Canaveral, working in test engineering for the space launch capsule. This was her third heavy-weight internship while at UA following stints with NASA and the United Launch Alliance. This fall, she returned to **UA** to complete her MBA and master's degree in aerospace engineering with the remainder of her National Merit scholarship. Through the Accelerated Master's Program, where she took graduate-level classes as an undergraduate, she will complete both additional degrees in only one year.

GLOBAL INFLUENCE

Matthew Berger came to **UA** already a legend in the world of paleoanthropology. In 2010, nine-year-old Matthew discovered the fossil of a new hominid species encased in a cave wall in the Cradle of Humankind, not far from his home in Johannesburg, South Africa. He came upon the fossil while he and his dog were exploring a cave near a site where his father, renowned paleoanthropologist Lee Berger, was working. Excavation around that first fossil revealed multiple skeletons of a new species, eventually becoming **the biggest hominid fossil discovery in history!**

Matthew wanted to attend college in the United States, and he and his family visited campuses up and down the East Coast - Ivy League schools and other public and private institutions. **UA's** strong academic reputation, outstanding anthropology department and close proximity to the Moundville Archeological Park were big selling points. But his campus visit sealed the deal.

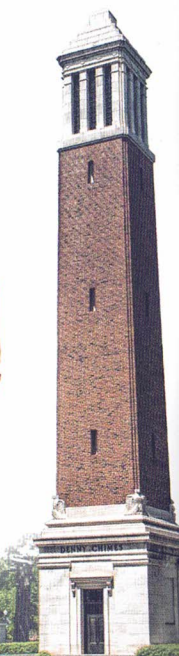


TUSCALOOSA

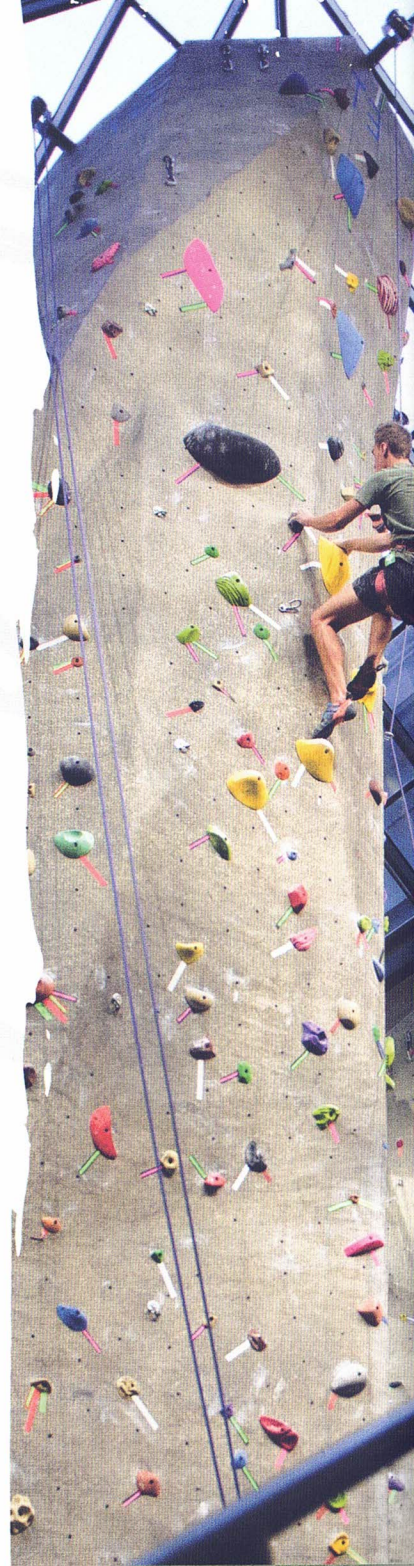

PRESIDENTIAL ELITE

A student with a **4.0+ GPA** and **36 ACT OR 1600 SAT** will be selected as a Presidential Elite Scholar and will receive:

- Value of tuition for up to four years or eight semesters for degree-seeking undergraduate and graduate or law studies
- First year of on-campus housing at regular room rate (based on assignment by Housing and Residential Communities)
- \$1,000 per year stipend for four years
- \$2,000 one-time allowance for use in summer research or international study (after completing one year of study at **UA**)
- \$2,000 Supe Store book scholarship (\$500 per year for four years)

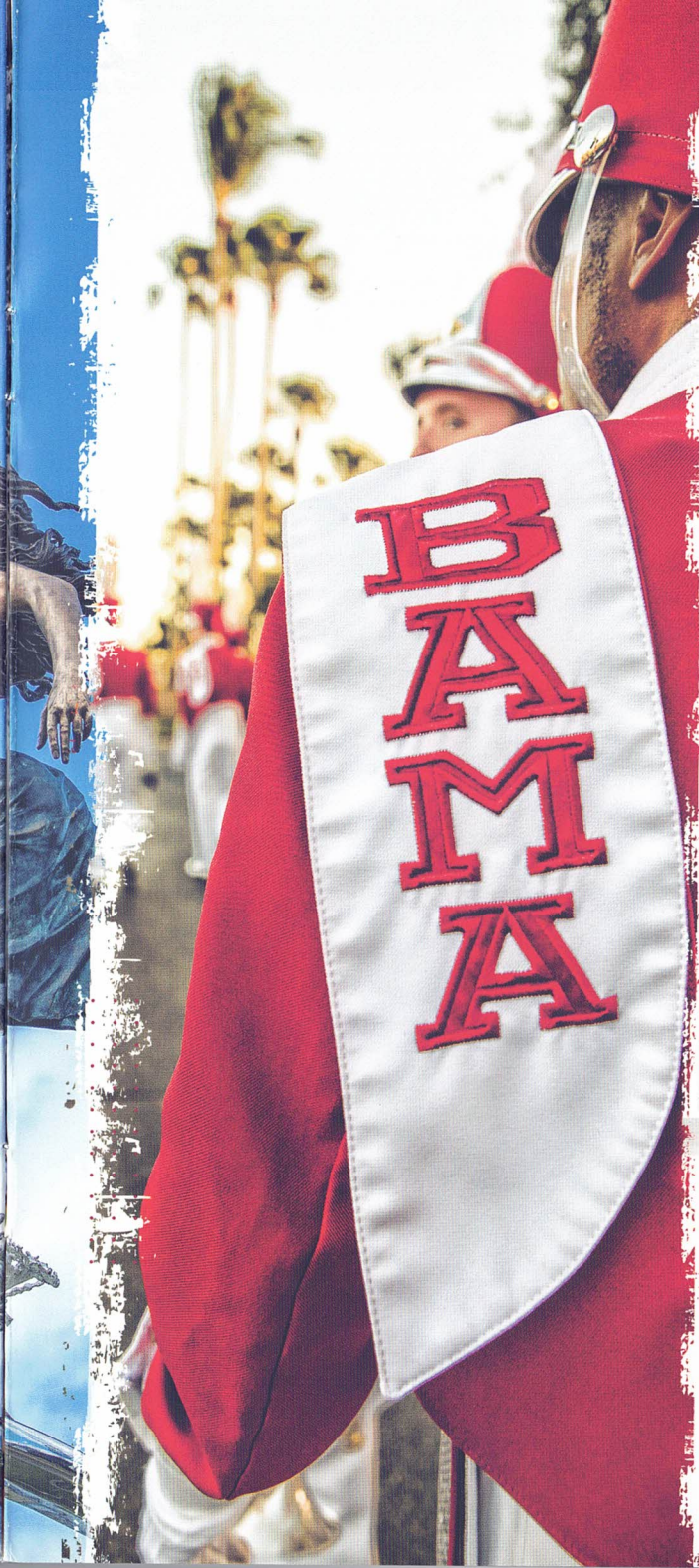
