Annual Meeting

By the end of **September**, **Davis-Emerson Middle School** will hold its annual meeting for all parents. Parents and students are notified of these meetings through (1) notices sent home with all students, (2) school intercom announcement both morning and afternoon, (3) through our school website, (4) through our Facebook page, (5) twitter, (6) through announcements in other languages when we have families where English is not their primary language, (7) call-outs, (8) Remind 101 (9) videos.

Flexible Schedule of Meetings

The leadership and faculty/staff of **Davis-Emerson Middle School** have a strong belief in the importance of parental involvement and therefore have put measures in place to offer parent meetings on a flexible schedule. Our annual meeting for parents of participating children will be offered both in the evening and a morning time. Conferences with teachers are encouraged and may be set up by appointment during teacher's planning times and before or after school. Parents may obtain information about their child's progress through progress reports, report cards, phone calls, access to iNow, notes to the teacher, email, and participation in workshops or other family activities. Interpreters will be provided if needed to facilitate communication at parent conferences.

Involvement of Parents in Planning, Review, and Improvement of Title I Programs

Davis-Emerson Middle School believes in involving parents in all aspects of its Title I programs. We have two parent representatives on our school-wide advisory committee who were active participants in the development of the plan and were involved from the first meeting of the school-wide committee. In addition, all parents were given the opportunity to review the plan and offer their input before the plan was approved. For the Parental Involvement Plan, all parents were given surveys at the end of the school year seeking their input on activities, training, and materials that the school should offer to parents next school year. Each year, the school-wide plan, including the parental involvement plan, is reviewed and evaluated. Results of parent surveys are reviewed by the parent representatives and entire school-wide advisory council in determining needed changes.

Timely Information about the Title I Program, the Curriculum, and Academic Assessments

At its annual meetings of parents at the beginning of the school year, **Davis-Emerson Middle School** will present information about its Title I programs, the curriculum, and forms of academic assessments used to measure student progress. Parents will learn about our school's program and the following subjects taught: reading, math, science and social studies and changes to our school wide behavior/attendance procedures. They will also learn about how to schedule parent-teacher conferences and how they can participate in decisions related to the education of their child. We will review the *Tuscaloosa County School System Student/Parent Information Guide*, which includes more detailed information on these topics and a copy of the parental involvement plan. Upon conclusion of the general meeting, parents will be invited to visit their child's classrooms and meet their teachers. At this time, teachers will provide additional information on the subjects they teach and how students are individually assessed.

Submission of Parent Concerns about Our Title Plan

In May of each year, **Davis-Emerson Middle School's** Title I Advisory Committee meets to review, evaluate, and revise our Parent Involvement Plan. There are two parents on the Committee who represent all the parents of the school. During the review process, all parents are notified of the review and their input is requested by submitting survey on parental involvement. This year notices were publicized via Remind 101, social media sites and our school website. The notices make parents aware that their input is requested in order to adjust and improve parental involvement and activities at Davis-Emerson Middle School.

School-Parent Compacts

Davis-Emerson Middle School revises its school-parent compact in April/May of each year in consultation with our school wide advisory committee and any parental comments received by teachers throughout the year. All parents will be given a copy of the new compact through open house enrollment packets and sent home with students during the beginning of the school year. A copy will be available on the school website and new students will be given one at the time of enrollment. The compact will be explained to the parents, and they will be asked to sign the compact signifying their commitment to working in partnership with the school and their child in ensuring that their child is successful in school. The compacts will be discussed with teachers at faculty meetings. Each teacher will be given the responsibility to explain the compact to the students and obtain the students' signatures. The teachers will sign the compacts and house them in his/her classroom for use during parent-teacher and/or student-teacher conferences.

At this time, **Davis-Emerson Middle School** does not have any migrant students. Every effort is made to accommodate parents with disabilities. The Tuscaloosa County School System policy for homebound is followed as needs exist for homebound services. Parents requiring assistance should contact the counselor, nurse, or administration for referral forms and assistance with the application process. Homebound services are provided through the central office of the Tuscaloosa County School System.
