

Exam Exemption For One Year (Four Nine-Week) Course:

In order to be exempt from a final exam at the end of a four nine-week grading period course, a 6-8 grade student must:

- Possess an A (90-100) average with 6 or fewer absences, or
- Possess a B (89-80) average with 4 or fewer absences, or
- Possess a C (70-79) average with 2 or fewer absences, AND
- Have no discipline referrals that results in detention, inschool intervention, or suspension during the term/semester.

The final course grade for students in grades 6-8 who meet exemption criteria will be determined from the average of the four nine-week grading periods.

These requirements for attendance are half for courses that are only a semester (starts in August and ends in December or starts in January and ends in May).
